Our aim, at Bound by Veterans, is to harness the therapeutic aspects of manual bookbinding to create an enduring and self-sustaining business for WIS Veterans. By providing training and access to qualifications, we support them with therapy, re-skilling and the possibility of a brighter future. We can now offer real education with verv concrete results.

The Stationers' Foundation funded our initial trial in 2011 and such was the success that, in September 2012. we were officially registered as a charity. In March 2013, we opened our classroom for the first time — a real milestone. A month later, our courses began and later that year, in November, our first veteran, Terry D'Eath, graduated.

As our work here takes

on momentum, so more people are becoming aware of the support we can provide to veterans and their partners, some of whom are in dire need of help, confidence and a purpose...all of which bookbinding provides. Kenny came to us after a life-threatening injury four years ago, receiving brain damage which left him unable to talk for months. He could not focus and has been left permanently mentally injured. After a career spanning 36 years in the Army, Kenny is now going in a new direction. Bookbinding is starting to provide him with an income, a purpose and we are so proud of him!



Spellbinding Training

We provide three types of training: informal introductory lessons as a "taster" for bookbinding, and formal courses leading (if desired) to national qualifications. Workshop days cover the wider aspect of bookbinding. There is no requirement to apply for City & Guilds awards, but veterans are

automatically registered and application for these nationally recognised qualifications is strongly encouraged. Courses and awards are available at Level 1 and Level 2, and each course covers the syllabus of one City & Guilds "Unit". By completing a Unit, a student can achieve a single craft Award. For

example, the successful completion of the
