BBV City & Guilds Level 3 - Diploma Gold Finishing Course

A two-day course in the last weekend of November found five BBV students in the Barn at Woodborough approaching the advanced skill of gold finishing with teacher Dieter Räder. Dieter has been bookbinding for over forty years and gold finishing is just one of his many skills. He has a passion for traditional methods in restoration and conservation of books and is very keen to pass on his 3 diploma. It was a fascinating two days with a huge amount of information to absorb and digest.

On the second day we were able to put in to practice what we had learned and what Dieter had demonstrated. Needless to say, in his demonstrations he made it look easy but we soon found how difficult it was in practice.

Veterans on Work Experience

Last July, two BBV Veterans who were interested in gaining work experience in a bindery began working in the Shepherds "end" of the Daffodil Barn. Gilly Turner and Dean Williams had both attended BBV courses and wanted to find out what goes on in a commercial bindery and to hone their skills by spending more time at the workbench.



Dean, who was one of the first Veterans to attend a course at the Barn when the charity started ten years ago, is keen to give something back to the charity by making up Explorer notebooks for sale. Gilly is very much a newcomer to BBV and the craft but intends to make a fulltime career out of bookbinding.

Both Gilly and Dean are fortunate in living within easy commuting distance of Woodborough and so are able to visit regularly. Their time at the workbench since July has therefore followed a progressive programme in three parts: they have had numerous days of instruction at their benches, they have attended City & Guilds Level 2 and 3 courses at the BBV workshop and finally have been involved in some of the in-house work for which BBV and the Shepherds bindery is responsible.

Whilst the C&G courses (such as the recent edge decoration and gold finishing ones) are challenging and exciting, it is probably the in-house work that tests their memory, adaptability and even stamina the most, and often requires a full

Brigadier as well as cleaning and repairing a pre-war Game Book from the Rannoch Estate in Scotland. In addition to sewing and casing in some Explorer book blocks, Dean has been rebinding books for a local library, including adding the lettering on spines in gold foil.

Both have also been heavily involved in manufacturing large red drop-back boxes for a major Shepherds job: the Macallan Almanac Volume 2, managed by the Edrington Distillery group.





It is against this background that Shepherds applied for funds from Edrington to sponsor an apprenticeship for Gilly. As Ali, our Chair, noted in her introduction we are delighted that this has been agreed and Gilly is all set to start her full-time apprenticeship with Shepherds in the New Year.

BOOKBINDING COURSES - 2022/2023 through Bound By Veterans

Courses at the Barn continue to flourish and the online Zoom courses being run by our Principal Tutor, Mylyn McColl, are proving very popular by those who have difficulty getting away or are unable to find accommodation near the Barn. Details of both in-person and online courses are shown below

The BBV Introduction to Bookbinding sessions are continuing to be held at Tedworth House and also at the Veterans' Outreach Support (VOS) in Portsmouth. In addition they are available through Veterans Tribe Scotland (VTS) and Help for Heroes (H4H) Scotland with online sessions.

Online tutorials (via Zoom) for the C&G Certificate Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) are now well established in the BBV course programme. This course is normally a 5-day (Mon to Fri) course but for the on-

Zoom on-line courses.

The online courses run from 10.00 to 16.00hrs each day but the tutor will be available until 16.30 to assist with questions and practice. A thirty-minute lunch break will be taken at approx 13.00. - 10 Jan (Tue) (10.30-12.30) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Tedworth House. This short session is for RRP Students at Tedworth House only. Students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook.
