C&G Level 2 (Unit 201/202) Design and Sampling (taught by Anita

Andrews) This course is for those who would like to achieve a certificate in Level 1 or 2 Bookbinding and who have no previous arts experience. You will put together a portfolio of samples relating to bookbinding, its materials and learn about colour and design.]

We will be sending out boxed tool kits and materials via DHL to those who register for the classes, and the tool kits will be collected by DHL after the course is finished. All you will need is a space a bit bigger than A3 to work on, a computer or tablet with wifi, good lighting and a bit of peace and quiet!

We will be offering more live webinar classes during the year in addition to the onsite sessions at the barn, when they can start up again. Watch this space! Also look below for details of courses coming up in the near future.

BOOKBINDING COURSES - 2021 at Bound By Veterans

There remains a desire to get courses at The Barn up and running again as soon as possible but in the meantime further courses are being planned online (via Zoom) and by the time you read this Newsletter the first three such courses will have been completed.

Online tutorials (via Zoom) for the Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) are now well established in the BBV course programme. This course is normally a 5-day (Mon to Fri) course but for the on-line course it has been split into two modules, the first of two days and the second of three. The new Unit 119 course is split into a three-day course for the first part and a two-day course for the second part. Courses run from 10.00 to 16.00 each day but the tutor will be available until 16.30 to assist with questions and practice. A thirty-minute lunch break will be taken each day at approx 13.00. Details of these courses are given below.

June 2021

Regrettably the courses planned to be held in the Barn at Woodborough in June have had to be cancelled. These are:

- 1-2 Jun (Tue-Wed) C&G Level 3 Module Cloth Reback.
- 7-11 Jun (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 Second Award Photo Albums & Slip Cases (Unit 119). (BBV Students only)
- 24-27 Jun (Thu-Sun) C&G Level 3 Module Laced-on Binding.

July 2021

At present the courses planned to be held in the Barn at Woodborough in July are still scheduled to take place there. In addition to these, we have added another Level 1 Unit 119 online course, (see below).

- 3-4 Jul (Sat-Sun) C&G Level 3 Module Leather-entry Slip Case. (At the Barn) This two-day assignment is part of the Storage and Enclosures module for Level 3 bookbinding. You will learn how to make a slipcase with a chamfered, rounded, leather entry. If taking the C&G course the slipcase would be made to hold your laced on leather binding.
- 12-16 Jul (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) (At the Barn) This is for complete beginners and is the first unit in the Level 1 C&G's certificate in Bookbinding. You will gain a core knowledge of basic bookbinding skills and will make single and multisection pamphlets.
- 19-21 Jul (Mon-Wed) (Part 1) & 26-27 Jul (Mon-Tue) Part 2 C&G Level 1 (Unit 119) Photograph album & slipcase (Online Course) For those with a little bookbinding experience, this online course is the second unit necessary for the Level 1 C&G certificate in Bookbinding, where you will learn how to make two different types of photograph album, one with folded guards, and one with stiff boards, and a lined cloth slipcase.

Paper-Covered Sides. (At the Barn) An optional assignment in the C&G Level 3 curriculum, where you will learn to make a laced-on hard binding with a French groove, which will be covered with quarter vellum and decorative paper sides.

Bookbinding Tips and Tricks by Mylyn McColl

This month Mylyn gives an overview of adhesives used in bookbinding and explains some of the many different types available.

"Modern bookbinding adhesives, principally PVA and EVA have been in common use since the 1970s and replaced the older hot glues, sometimes referred to as 'Scotch' or animal glue which were made from bones and hide. The option to use the modern white glues has several advantages."

Both PVA and EVA can be used for almost all binding processes that involve cloth and paper. PVA (Poly Vinyl Acetate) and EVA (Ethylene-vinyl Acetate) have very little odour and they are instantly ready for use and are quick drying. EVA is also reversible in water.



But EVA and PVA's fast drying time requires you to work quickly and although you can thin them down with water, most binders prefer to use a small amount of paste mixed in to prolong the open time and make it easier to use. This is particularly useful in hot weather or in very dry atmospheres. You can also buy a ready mixed 50/50 of EVA and paste from Shepherds for all round use.

PASTE

Many professional bookbinders make their own paste, particularly those working in the traditional way with leather and fine binding. A simple paste can be made from wheat starch and water and will last several days when refrigerated or you can buy ready made starch and rice pastes from suppliers such as Shepherds and Hewit."



As you progress with bookbinding you will find many circumstances where paste is preferable to EVA; this is particularly true in fine leather work and paper repairs. Many binders may use both Paste and EVA simultaneously, mixing them together according to need.

But for those of you working mainly with paper and bookcloth, PVA/EVA and PVA paste mix will cover most of your needs.
