COURSE NEWS

BBV BEGINNERS' BOOKBINDING SESSIONS. Formerly these were monthly, two-hour sessions conducted at Tedworth house, in Tidworth, giving service personnel who were registered on the Rolling Recovery Programme (RRP) a taster of what bookbinding was all about. From this they could, if they wished, subsequently embark on courses at The Daffodil Barn at Woodborough, about half an hour's drive from Tidworth. These introductory sessions have had to be suspended at Tedworth House but BBV has now developed a new short online session which is to be delivered via Zoom. A trial online session was conducted at the end of October, led by BBV's Principal Tutor, Mylyn McColl, and was a great success. The key points about the session are:

- You can participate in the comfort of your own home, from anywhere.
- All the tools and materials you need for the course will be sent to you by DHL

Please note, places will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis and please get your bid in early if you are wanting to attend the live webinar courses because we need time to get the tool kits and materials out to you. Even if you have done the beginners course before, you might want to refresh your memory and hone your skills. You will have the chance to ask questions and get personal attention as it is all live.

We will be sending out boxed tool kits and materials via DHL to those who register for the classes, and the tool kits will be collected by DHL after the course is finished. All you will need is a space a bit bigger than A3 to work on, a computer or tablet with wifi, good lighting and a bit of peace and quiet!

We will be offering more live webinar classes during the year in addition to the onsite sessions at the barn, now they have started up again. Watch this space! Also look below for details of courses coming up in the near future.

BOOKBINDING COURSES - 2021/22 at Bound By Veterans

We are now able to offer courses at the Barn again but the online Zoom courses being run by Mylyn McColl are proving very popular by those who have difficulty getting away or are unable to find accommodation near the Barn. Details of what is coming up are shown below

Online tutorials (via Zoom) for the Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) are now well established in the BBV course programme. This course is normally a 5-day (Mon to Fri) course but for the on-line course it has been split into two modules, the first of two days and the second of three. The new Unit 119 course is split into a three-day course for the first part and a two-day course for the second part.

In addition, C&G's Level 2 Courses (Units 220 and 221) are now available as Zoom on-line courses.

The online courses are run from 10.00 to 16.00 each day but the tutor will be available until 16.30 to assist with questions and practice. A thirty-minute lunch break will be taken each day at approx 13.00. Details of these courses are given below.

- 22-26 (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 (Unit 119) Photograph Albums and Slipcase. (At the Barn). For those with a little bookbinding experience, this course is the second unit necessary for the Level 1 C&G certificate in Bookbinding, where you will learn how to make two different types of photograph album, one with folded guards, and one with stiff boards, and a lined cloth slipcase.
- 30 Nov 1 Dec (Tue-Wed) Paper Repairs. (At the Barn). When
 rebinding old books it will often be necessary to repair sections or tears –
 during this two-day course you will learn how to make simple paper
 repairs in various ways.

December 2021

 6-10 (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) (Pamphlet Binding and Multi-section Binding) (At the Barn) This is for complete beginners and is the first unit in the Level 1 C&G's certificate in Bookbinding. You will gain a core knowledge of basic bookbinding skills and will make a single section pamphlet and multisection binding.

January 2022

- 11-13 (Tue-Thu) C&G Level 2 (Unit 201/202) Design and Sampling
 (At the Barn) In this fun 3-day course you will put together a portfolio of
 samples relating to bookbinding, its materials and learn about colour and
 design. As well as make paste papers. This course is for those who
 would like to achieve a certificate in Level 1 or 2 Bookbinding and who
 have no previous arts experience.
- 17-21 (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 2 (Unit 221) Alternative and Historical Binding (At the Barn) This course is the second unit in the Level 2 C&G certificate in Bookbinding. You will learn how to make a range of nonadhesive bindings, including a Coptic binding. For those with a little bookbinding experience.
- 25-26 Jan (Tue-Wed) (Part 1 Pamphlet Binding) and 1-3 Feb (Tue-Thu) (Part 2 Multi-Section Binding) (On-line Zoom Course) This is for complete beginners and is the first unit in the Level 1 C&G's certificate

Bookbinding Tips and Tricks by Mylyn McColl

This month Mylyn talks about **Spine Linings**.

When learning bookbinding one of the first things we consider is spine linings, structurally they are essential to a binding. From a single section, where it helps to reinforce the endpaper joint, to multi-section bindings where they also keep the spine of stitched sections nice and tight.

There are many different materials you can use for reinforcing the spine area:

Mull - comes in two thickness: No.1 - open weave and No.4 - close weave which is a bit stronger, both are good standard spine linings for most bindings.





Fray Not– is 100% linen and is very thin yet strong, good for fine bindings.

Calico or Jaconnette- a starch filled calico that comes in black or white and is a bit thicker than mull or fray not.




linen material but can also be used as a spine lining on large bindings

And for lining the spine after you have used mull, fray not etc, you can use:

Kraft paper 90gsm (Brown)– a good all round spine lining





Archival Kraft 120gsm (grey) - as the name suggests it is archival grade so good for using on restoration and conservation as well as fine bindings.

And finally A Tip - remember that you can moisten the spine after you have applied your spine linings on a multi section book so that when the Kraft paper dries it shrinks and keeps the spine lovely and tight.
