Rob Shepherd - Co-founder of Bound by Veterans



It is with great sadness that we have to report the death of Rob Shepherd, Managing Director of Shepherds Bookbinders Ltd and co-founder of Bound by Veterans, who died on 13th August after a long illness. He set up his bookbinding business in 1988 and not only became widely known and respected amongst the bookbinding community but was also passionate about training and spared no effort in trying novel

Project, and as its prime sponsor helped it reach charitable status a year later. He then helped place Bound by Veterans on a secure footing by persuading the City & Guilds Institute to reinstate bookbinding onto its list of heritage crafts and provided the means by which we are now able to award these internationally recognised City & Guilds qualifications to Veterans. In recent years he was a catalyst for the creation of the Queen's Bindery Apprenticeship Scheme and pivotal in the development of national Apprenticeship standards for bookbinding, although perhaps behind it all he was inspired by a keen desire to find Veterans from his "special" charity who might graduate from classes at the Daffodil Barn to a full-blown commercial apprenticeship in the bookbinding trade.

He promoted the charity tirelessly through the Worshipful Company of Stationers, of which he was a Liveryman, and the many other links he had made in the bookbinding and commercial world. He gave us a solid financial start and mapped out a development programme that we follow today. It combines craft training with the therapeutic support for which this charity has become synonymous, and produces a regime that promotes confidence, self-esteem and mental well-being. We will miss his advice and influence but, above all, will miss a real gentleman who supported us with charm, dedication and determination.

COURSE NEWS

BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Sessions

BBV began running these courses about 8 years ago at Tedworth House in Tidworth. The scheme faltered during the Covid pandemic but it has resumed at Tedworth House now on a regular, monthly, basis and the sessions there are taught by BBV volunteers. In addition some courses are now given remotely by Zoom by our Principal Tutor, Mylyn McColl. Also, they are available as in-person courses in Portsmouth and in Scotland. Bound by Veterans Intern Training

BBV has developed a training programme for interns to learn about bookbinding and develop their skills in the craft. A summary of the scheme is:

Aim. *To produce rapidly trained bookbinders who are qualified at least to C&G*

- *Workshop Instruction and "Bench-Time"*
- *City & Guilds Tuition up to Level 3*
- *External Educational Visits*
- *In-House work for Sponsors (Bound by Veterans and Shepherds)*

Programme. *The weekly training programmes will include elements of more than one facet. This aims to provide plenty of variety and to promote interest in the profession.*

BBV currently has two veterans who have embarked on the internship, Gilly Turner and Dean Williams. As part of the course includes external educational visits one was arranged to Bayntun's, a commercial bindery in Bath. Our Principal Tutor, Myln, accompanied the two students on the visit, and her report of the visit is below.

Edward Bayntun-Coward welcomed us and gave a very informative history of the building, it used to be a post office sorting building before George Bayntun took it on in the 1930s and some of the benches are the original sorting desks. We then had a good look around the bindery where Don showed how they thin leather, rather than splitting it they have a machine that sands the thickness away. We saw the gold edging station - all books are edged by hand with gold leaf. Then Spike talked us through some of the design processes as we looked at a brochure of some of their prestigious bindings. Next we moved on to see Tony at work in the finishing department working on a lovely design of Animal Farm with a lovely pig - just one of the binderies thousands of hand tools.

drawers of blocks from previous bindings including Winnie the Pooh and Alice in Wonderland.



Edward then took us upstairs to see some of his collection including some spectacular French Bindings - we talked about how we don't know who actually bound the books as the French way is that the designer gets the kudos and the binder is usually an unknown craftsman.

It was fascinating to see a different bindery space, how it functions with different staff taking on different stages and what type of work they produce. Dean and Gilly very much enjoyed the experience and asked many interesting questions.



The exhibition of bindings was also very good and it was great to see the different variety from case binding, to fine leather binding, gold finishing, to artist book.

The whole team were very generous with their time and knowledge, we were there for 2 hours and assured Dean and Gilly would be welcomed back if they wished to visit again in the future. - *Mylyn*

BOOKBINDING COURSES - 2022 through Bound By Veterans

Courses at the Barn continue to flourish and the online Zoom courses being run by our Principal Tutor, Mylyn McColl, are proving very popular by those who have difficulty getting away or are unable to find accommodation near the Barn. Details of both in-person and online courses are shown below

The BBV Introduction to Bookbinding sessions are continuing to be held at Tedworth House and also at the Veterans' Outreach Support (VOS) in

Online tutorials (via Zoom) for the C&G Certificate Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) are now well established in the BBV course programme. This course is normally a 5-day (Mon to Fri) course but for the on-line course it has been split into two modules, spread over two weeks.

In addition, C&G's Level 2 Courses (Units 220 and 221) are now available as Zoom on-line courses.

The online courses run from 10.00 to 16.00 each day but the tutor will be available until 16.30 to assist with questions and practice. A thirty-minute lunch break will be taken at approx 13.00. Details of these courses are given below.

October 2022

- **24-28 Oct (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 2 (Unit 220) Half Leather Case Binding**
This course is the first unit in the Level 2 C&G certificate in Bookbinding. You will learn how to make casebound leather books in quarter and half leather, and how to pare leather and sharpen knives. Some bookbinding experience is necessary.
- **26 Oct (Wed) (1030-1230) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Veterans Outreach Support (Portsmouth) (VOS).** This is an In-Person group session at The Royal Maritime Club Portsmouth where students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook. Contact Philippa Clare (philippa.clare.vosp@gmail.com) facilitator for VOS, for further details

November 2022

- **1 Nov (Tue) (10.30-12.30) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Tedworth House.** This short session is for RRP Students at Tedworth House only. Students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook.
- **1-3 Nov (Tue-Thu) C&G Level 2 (Unit 201/202) Design and Sampling Course.** This course is for those who would like to achieve a certificate in Level 1 or 2 Bookbinding and who have no previous arts experience. You will put together a portfolio of samples relating to bookbinding, its materials and learn about colour and design.
- **10 Nov (Thu) Edge Decoration.** Edges are another surface for the binder's creativity to shine but they are often overlooked. They act as an

perfect glass smooth finish to your edges and work through a variety of decorative finishes. From basic sprinkling and sponging through graphite, marbling, paste, gaufering and gold leaf.

- **14-18 Nov (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 (Unit 118) Pamphlet and Multi-section bindings**

For complete beginners, this is the first unit in the Level 1 C&G certificate in Bookbinding, where you will gain a core knowledge of the basic skills and make single and multi-section bindings in quarter, half and full cloth.

- **16 Nov (Wed) (1830-2030) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Veterans Outreach Support (Portsmouth) (VOS).** This is an In-Person group session at The Royal Maritime Club Portsmouth where students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook. Contact Philippa Clare (philippa.clare.vosp@gmail.com) facilitator for VOS, for further details

- **26-27 Nov (Sat-Sun) C&G Level 3 Diploma Gold Leaf Finishing**

Two days in which you will learn the traditional way to letter a book in gold leaf with both hand tools and typeholder, and decorate a lather label.

- **29 Nov - 1 Dec (Tue-Thu) & 6-7 Dec (Tue-Wed) C&G Level 2 (Unit 220) Leather Case Binding** This course is the first unit in the Level 2 C&G certificate in Bookbinding. You will learn how to make casebound leather books in quarter and half leather, and how to pare leather and sharpen knives. Some bookbinding experience is necessary.
