Faced with medical discharge, life as a civilian after 21yrs Service in the Royal Air Force and a diagnosis of PTSD, it was all overwhelming and my confidence was at its lowest.

Bound by Veterans encouraged me to try a new skill, work with like-minded individuals who would understand me. Small groups in the workshop meant that I was able to slowly work on my communication and confidence.

Such experienced tutors sharing their knowledge teaching me, guiding me through a methodical and beautiful new craft and timeless skill.

I had not done anything like this before, but it allowed me to become absorbed in the beauty, art and precision of bookbinding and by doing so meant that other worries or stressors were kept at bay whilst in that moment I felt a calm.

I found with encouragement from the tutors and the team at BBV I could try new things, explore my creativity and successfully produce a beautiful book.

I have now signed onto the City and Guilds course as I have enjoyed this so much and can't explain how much it has helped me find space in such a busy head.

Whilst on the course I was accommodated locally and BBV covered this cost, without it I would just not have been able to attend as I live over 3 hrs away. I was able to review my work each night and do a little homework, again helping maintain the peace and calm the course had given me.

I couldn't recommend this course more to any veteran particularly when your path is a little rocky the support of BBV really does smooth the way. "





BOOKBINDING COURSES - 2023 through Bound By Veterans

Courses at the Barn continue to flourish and the online Zoom courses being run by our Principal Tutor, Mylyn McColl, are proving very popular by those who have difficulty getting away or are unable to find accommodation near the Barn. Details of both in-person and online courses are shown below

The BBV Introduction to Bookbinding sessions are continuing to be held at Tedworth House and also at the Veterans' Outreach Support (VOS) in Portsmouth. In addition they are available through Veterans Tribe Scotland (VTS) and Help for Heroes (H4H) Scotland with online and in-person sessions.

Online tutorials (via Zoom) for the C&G Certificate Level 1 Foundation Bookbinding Course (Unit 118) are now well established in the BBV course programme. This course is normally a 5-day (Mon to Fri), in-person course but for the on-line course it has been split into two modules, spread over two weeks.

In addition, C&G's Level 2 Courses (Units 220 and 221) are now available as Zoom on-line courses.

The online courses run from 10.00 to 16.00hrs each day but the tutor will be available until 16.30 to assist with questions and practice. A thirty-minute lunch break will be taken at approx 13.00. Details of these courses are given below.

online tutorial courses please book early to ensure we can get the tool kits to you in time. Remember **FIRST-COME-FIRST-SERVED**.

October 2023

- 3-4 Oct (Tue-Wed) C&G Level 3 Module Cloth Reback One of the most useful skills to learn if you are trying to make a living from bookbinding, this two-day course will teach you how to repair and reback cloth hardback bindings.
- 9-13 Oct (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 2 Unit 220 Leather Case Binding. This course is the first unit in the Level 2 C&G Certificate in Bookbinding. You will learn how to make case-bound leather books in quarter and half leather, and how to pare leather and sharpen knives. Some bookbinding experience is necessary.
- 17-19 Oct (Tue-Thu) Unit 201/202 Design and Sampling. This course is for those who would like to achieve a certificate in Level 1 or 2 Bookbinding and who have no previous arts experience. You will put together a portfolio of samples relating to bookbinding, its materials and learn about colour and design.
- 21-23 Oct (Sat-Mon) and 28-30 Oct (Sat-Mon) C&G Level 3 Module, Qtr-Vellum Binding (Parts 1 and 2). An optional assignment in the C&G Level 3 curriculum, where you will learn to make a laced-on hard binding with a French groove, which will be covered with quarter vellum and decorative paper sides.
- 25 Oct (Tue) (1800-2000) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session (for VOS Students only.) This short session provides an opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook. To book a place please contact Wendy Pearson at VOS. (wendy.pearson@vosuk.org)
- 28-30 Oct (Sat-Mon) C&G Level 3 Module, Qtr-Vellum Binding (Part 2). See above
- 31 Oct (Tue) (1030-1230) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Tedworth House. This short session is for RRP Students at Tedworth House only. Students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook
- 31 Oct 2 Nov (Tue-Thu) and 7-8 Nov (Tue-Wed) C&G Level 2 Unit (221). Online course via ZOOM. Non adhesive/alternative bindings. This is the second unit in the Level 2 certificate in Bookbinding. You will learn to make a range of non-adhesive bindings, including a Coptic-style of binding.

November 2023

sewing tapes/cords of a book and cover a book in full leather by drawing it on. Students should have at least completed the level 2 bookbinding unit.

- 9 Nov (Thu) C&G Level 3 Module Edge Decoration. Edges are another surface for the binder's creativity to shine but they are often overlooked. They act as an important protective barrier as well as being a key design element of a fine binding. In this workshop, Kate will show you how to achieve the perfect glass smooth finish to your edges and work through a variety of decorative finishes. From basic sprinkling and sponging through graphite, marbling, paste, gauffering and gold leaf.
- 13-17 Nov (Mon-Fri) C&G Level 1 Unit 119. Photograph Albums & Slip Case. For those with a little bookbinding experience, this course is the second unit necessary for the Level 1 C&G certificate in Bookbinding, where you will learn how to make two different types of photograph album, one with folded guards, and one with stiff boards, and a lined cloth slipcase.
- 21-23 Nov (Tue-Wed) C&G Level 3. This two-day assignment is part of the Storage & Enclosures module for Level 3 Bookbinding. You will learn how to make a slip case with a chamfered, rounded, leather entry. If taking the C&G Level 3 qualification, the slipcase would be made to hold your laced-on leather binding.
- 28 Nov (Tue) (1030-1230) BBV Introduction to Bookbinding Session at Tedworth House. This short session is for RRP Students at Tedworth House only. Students will have the opportunity to learn some basic bookbinding techniques and make a small notebook.

December 2023

- 4-8 Dec (Mon-Fri) C&G Level I (Unit 118) Pamphlet and Multisection bindings (Course held at the Barn, Woodborough)
 For complete beginners, this is the first unit in the Level 1 C&G certificate in Bookbinding, where you will gain a core knowledge of the basic skills and make single and multi-section bindings in quarter, half and full cloth.
- **12-14 Dec (Tue-Thu) C&G Level 3 Module Leather Reback.** Following on from cloth rebacking, this course will teach you the fine skills involved in sympathetically rebacking a leather book. These two courses combine as a mandatory assignment for the C&G Level 3 Diploma in Bookbinding.

You will have the chance to ask questions and get personal attention as it is all live.

We send out boxed tool kits and materials, via DHL, to those who register for the online classes, and the tool kits will be collected by DHL after the course is finished. All you will need is a space a bit bigger than A3 to work on, a computer or tablet with wifi, good lighting and a bit of peace and quiet!

We will be offering more live webinar classes during the year in addition to the onsite sessions at the barn. Watch this space! Also look above for details of courses coming up in the near future.

Bookbinding Tips and Tricks

I recently scratched my beloved Teflon folder by using it on some metal beading on a box I was restoring.



Damage to the folder can be clearly seen

To bring it back to its original glory I used wet and dry paper to smooth off the surface again. Starting with an 800, working through different grits and finishing with a 5000 grit. Use the paper wet and avoid using sandpaper as you don't want to create plastic dust.



As you can see it did the trick and I am able to use my folder on delicate surfaces again.

them to suit your need. Bone folders are easily shaped using regular sand paper as well as wet & dry. Again start with a heavier grit working your way up to the finer grit to give them a smooth finish and it is best to have the paper wet or work outside to avoid bone dust.
